

MULTIMODALITY

Rhetoric is a multimodal art, which means that rhetoric teaches us to approach each document as a multimodal document. That is, every document contains multiple modalities (or modes) of communication (either deliberately or unintentionally).

The Five Modalities:

1. Linguistic (referring to things like words, sentences, paragraphs, and all of the concerns associated with these elements, including word choice, grammar, punctuation, style, etc.)
2. Aural (referring to tone, volume, emphasis, accent, rhythm, silence, and all of the concerns associated with these elements)
3. Visual (referring to things like color, size, shape, layout, perspective, etc.)
4. Gestural (referring to things like bodily movement and expressions)
5. Spatial (referring to things like organization, arrangement, proximity, location, etc.)

Multimodality also refers to the genres which are comprised of these modes:

1. Aural forms (such as sound, speech, music, etc.)
2. Written forms (such as text, documents, websites, etc.)
3. Visual forms (such as images, graphics, charts, maps, animations, etc.)
4. Gestural forms (such as dance, body language, walking, etc.)
5. Mixed/Blended/Hybrid Forms (e.g., motion pictures, which have may have all of these modalities).

The more complicated the genre, the more modes permeate (or are included) in the document.

Your job as a student of rhetoric is to learn and to apply these different concepts into the creation of various compositions (text, speech, graphics, etc.) for this course and beyond.

GENRE BY MODALITY (LIST)

Genre refers to the placement or categorization of a document/project, which is made distinct by its style, its content, and its form.
